## A BILL

To amend title 49, United States Code, to prohibit access by certain individuals to certain areas of airports, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLES.
- This Act may be cited as the "Secure Airports From
- 5 Enemies Act" or the "SAFE Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON ACCESS BY CERTAIN INDIVID-
- 7 UALS TO CERTAIN AREAS OF AIRPORTS.
- 8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter I of chapter 449 of
- 9 title 49, United States Code, is amended by adding at the
- 10 end the following:

1	"§ 44930. Prohibition on certain access by certain in-

3	"(a) Definitions.—In this section, the terms 'se-
4	cured area', 'Security Identification Display Area', and
5	'sterile area' have the meanings given such terms in sec-
6	tion 1540.5 of title 49, Code of Federal Regulations.
7	"(b) In General.—Notwithstanding any other pro-
8	vision of law, the Administrator of the Transportation Se-
9	curity Administration may not permit any access to the
0	locations specified in subsection (c) to any individual who
1	is a representative of, or acting on behalf of, a country
2	specified in subsection (d).
3	"(c) Locations Specified.—The locations specified
4	in this subsection are the following:
5	"(1) The secured area of an airport.
6	"(2) The Security Identification Display Area
7	of an airport.
8	"(3) The sterile area of an airport.
9	"(4) The air cargo area of an airport.
0.	"(d) Countries Specified.—A country specified in
1	this subsection is a country the government of which the
2	Secretary of State determines, or has determined at any
3	time during the immediately preceding 3 years, has re-
4	peatedly provided support for international terrorism pur-
5	suant to—

1	"(1) section $1754(c)(1)(A)$ of the Export Con-
2	trol Reform Act of 2018 (50 U.S.C. 4813(c)(1)(A));
3	"(2) section 620A of the Foreign Assistance
4	Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2371);
5	"(3) section 40 of the Arms Export Control Act
6	(22 U.S.C. 2780); or
7	"(4) any other provision of law.".
8	(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of contents
9	for subchapter I of chapter 449 of title 49, United States
10	Code, is amended by adding at the following:

"44930. Prohibition on certain access by certain individuals.".
