On behalf of the 140,000 members of the National Association of Home Builders (NAHB), I write in strong support of Division A of the latest draft of the *Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act.* This legislation will empower the Small Business Administration (SBA) to provide critical financial assistance to small businesses across America as they face uniquely trying times.

The housing sector, which is largely comprised of smaller, family-owned businesses, currently contributes 14.6% of Gross Domestic Product and is a major engine of growth for the economy. Keeping the men and women of the industry building must be a priority. If construction is disrupted, it creates a domino effect leading to dire negative economic repercussions for an already-burdened economy. Division A of the latest draft of the *CARES Act* ensures all small businesses with not more than 500 employees "shall be eligible to receive a loan under section 7(a) of the Small Business Act" and thus will have access to the necessary capital to weather the current and future economic disruption wrought by the coronavirus. NAHB is particularly grateful that the Small Business Act makes clear the funding under SBA's 7a loan program extends to residential construction and remodeling.
