A BILL

To establish a moratorium on energy development in certain areas of the Gulf of Mexico, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Preserving the Gulf

5 Test Range to Ensure Military Readiness Act".

6 SEC. 2. MORATORIUM ON ENERGY DEVELOPMENT IN CER-

- 7 TAIN AREAS OF GULF OF MEXICO.
- 8 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:
- 9 (1) MILITARY MISSION LINE.—The term "Mili10 tary Mission Line" has the meaning given the term

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in section 102 of the Gulf of Mexico Energy Security
 Act of 2006 (43 U.S.C. 1331 note; Public Law 109–
 432).

4 (2) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means
5 the Secretary of the Interior.

6 (b) MORATORIUM.—Effective during the period be7 ginning on the date of enactment of this Act and ending
8 on June 30, 2032, the Secretary shall not offer for leasing,
9 preleasing, or any related activity for energy development
10 of any kind—

(1) any area east of the Military Mission Linein the Gulf of Mexico; or

13 (2) any area of the outer Continental Shelf de-14 scribed in subparagraph (A), (B), or (C) of para-15 graph (2) of subsection (d), if oil, gas, wind, or any 16 other form of energy exploration, leasing, or develop-17 ment in that area has been identified in a report 18 under that subsection as having any adverse effect 19 on the national security of the United States or the 20 military readiness or testing capabilities of the De-21 partment of Defense.

(c) ENVIRONMENTAL EXCEPTIONS.—Notwithstanding subsection (b), the Secretary may issue leases in
areas described in that subsection for environmental conservation purposes, including the purposes of shore protec-

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tion, beach nourishment and restoration, wetlands restora tion, and habitat protection.

3 (d) Reports.—

4 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days 5 after the date of enactment of this Act, and not 6 later than June 30, 2031, the Secretary of Defense 7 shall submit to the Committees on Appropriations 8 and Armed Services of the Senate and the Commit-9 tees on Appropriations and Armed Services of the 10 House of Representatives a report that describes the 11 impact of oil, gas, wind, and any other form of en-12 ergy exploration, leasing, or development in areas of 13 the outer Continental Shelf described in paragraph 14 (2) on the national security of the United States and 15 the military readiness and testing capabilities of the 16 Department of Defense.

17 (2) AREAS DESCRIBED.—The areas of the outer
18 Continental Shelf referred to in paragraph (1) are
19 the following:

20 (A) Any area west of the Military Mission
21 Line in the Eastern Gulf of Mexico Planning
22 Area.

- 23 (B) The South Atlantic Planning Area.
 - (C) The Straits of Florida Planning Area.
